Quarterly Progress Report ACE Screening and Clinician Training Data

The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) and the Office of the

California Surgeon General are leading ACEs Aware, a first-in-the-nation, statewide effort to implement screening for Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and treat toxic stress to improve the health and well-being of Californians. ACEs Aware offers clinical teams training, clinical protocols, and payment for screening

children, adolescents, and adults for ACEs. This quarterly progress report provides the following data:

Additionally, 36% plan to change their treatment or management


approach based on the patient's ACE score and toxic stress risk assessment, and 35% plan to apply a clinical algorithm on ACEs and toxic stress to guide patient care.



The screens in this report are collected by capturing claims utilizing the designated G9919 and G9920 codes for ACE screenings. Any additional screenings that were not documented with these codes would not be counted in this report.
